

Thank you for ordering GLEWC's Equine First Aid Kit



Our first aid kit contains the following items:

- Digital thermometer
- Stethoscope
- Bandaging supplies
 - Telfa pads
 - Roll/sheet cotton
 - Roll gauze
 - Vetwrap
 - Elastikon
- Triple antibiotic eye ointment (non-steroidal)
- Eye wash
- 1 package of sterile 4 x 4 gauze sponges
- Betadine solution
- Saline solution
- Latex exam gloves
- Bandage scissor
- Dose Syringe
- Antibiotic wound ointment



GLEWC also recommends purchasing these additional items:

- Banamine paste*
- Phenylbutazone (Bute) Paste/tablets*
- Clippers with 40 blade
- Flashlight
- Instant cold pack
- Poultice
- Epsom salts
- Oral electrolytes
- 4 clean quilts with standing wraps (stable wraps)

* Ask your Great Lakes Equine Wellness Center veterinarian for a prescription. Banamine and Bute are prescription medications and should not be given unless directed on the phone by a veterinarian.

VITAL SIGNS

Heart Rate (The HR is taken low on the left side of the horse in the area of the girth just behind the elbow.)	24-44 beats/min (adults) 80-100 beats/min (foals)
Respiratory Rate	8-15 breaths/min (adults) 20-60 breaths/min (foal)
Temperature (Take rectally & lubricate with vaseline, KY jelly or saliva.)	99-101° F (adults) 99-102° F (foals)
Mucous Membranes	Pale pink to pink in color, moist to the touch
Capillary Refill Time (CRT)	Less than 2 seconds
